Subject: Update Regarding the Kumamoto Earthquake

Dear Valued Customers,

Thank you very much for your continued trust in and support of UNISIS products.

As you may already be aware from the news, a magnitude 7.1 earthquake struck Kumamoto Prefecture in the Kyushu region of Japan on July 28, 2026 (seismic intensity 7, the highest level in Japan).

The earthquake occurred at a shallow depth, causing significant damage, including collapsed buildings and damaged infrastructure. Rescue operations are ongoing, and many casualties have been reported. The epicenter was in the same area where another major earthquake occurred approximately 10 years ago. Although the earthquake was very strong, the damage has remained largely localized.

We have received inquiries from customers regarding the impact on our operations. We would like to assure you that UNISIS headquarters in Tokyo has not been affected. Our sales office in Hakata and our new Kyushu Factory in Fukuoka City also sustained no damage.

As part of our Business Continuity Plan (BCP), UNISIS has established a geographically diversified production network. Following the establishment of our Hokkaido Factory as a backup for our Saitama Factory, we have also established our Kyushu Factory to further strengthen our supply system. This enables us to maintain a stable supply of our products even in the event of earthquakes, major typhoons, or other natural disasters.

We will continue to ensure the safety of our employees, strengthen cooperation with our business partners, and work to maintain a stable and uninterrupted supply of our products under any circumstances.
